HR PRACTICES FOR HARNESSING THE POTENTIAL OF A MILLENNIAL WORKFORCE

The School of Management, GD Goenka University organized its 2nd HR Summit, Heuristic 2018, on 16 November 2018. Rapid transformation of the business landscape has led to evolving HR challenges. Identifying and addressing the key challenges will enable the HR function to act as true business partners and add value to the organization. HR practitioners, academia and students are aware about one of the biggest challenges facing HR today; the coming of age of a largely Millennial workforce. During this one day event, renowned professionals, leading HR professionals across multiple sectors and stalwarts from multiple domains deliberated during the panel

discussions on the following sub-themes:

- a. Addressing the Skill-Employability Gap of Millennial
- b. Retention and Engagement Strategies for Millennial

The event started by invoking the blessings of Goddess Saraswati followed by a welcome address by the Honourable President, GDGU, Prof. (Dr.) Suku Bhaskaran. In his address, the President applauded the School of Management for organizing this amazing networking opportunity between Industry stalwarts and the University. He then





highlighted that HR designs its own systems and is extremely subjective in nature. He added that for all the educational institutions the need of the hour is to train their students with the skill sets needed to prepare them for the future. After the welcome address, a briefing about the HR Summit was given by Prof. (Dr.) Kim Menezes, Summit Chair and Dean, School of Management. Dr. Menezes provided a backdrop of the Summit and emphasized that with the inevitable business changes, HR professionals will have to play diverse challenging roles in the coming times. She elaborated on the relevance of the theme in current times.

The Chief Guest of the summit, Mr. Rajesh Padmanabhan, Director and

CHRO, Welspun Group then delivered the keynote speech. He regaled the audience with instances from his vast experience and offered 12 critical points about managing millennial, for e.g. managing outcomes instead of managing people, importance of execution and team dynamics, learning and retention and adaptability. He also said that change is inherent. One should make things happen. He also emphasized on enjoying life. The strategic thinking should have vision, goals, action and results. Individuals should have business sense, cross cultural abilities, importance on interpersonal skills, be selflessly driven, career transition should exist and one should have a broader outlook with a global mindset. He also said that EQ is more important than IQ. He left us with a lot of food for thought with his 3Cs model of HR: Culture, Capabilities and Contribution. He gave a strong message "Do not script your life". The Inaugural session was followed by Panel Discussion on the theme, "Addressing the Skill-Employability Gap of Millennial". Esteemed panelists comprised of Chief Guest & Session Moderator-Mr. Rajesh Padmanabhan, Director and CHRO, Welspun Group, Mr. S.L Raina, HR & Legal Consultant, Former Director-HR, GAIL India Ltd., Mr. Saif Ahmed, Skills Enablement Lead- IBM, Ms. Shivani Malhotra, Founder & CEO, Positive Vibes Consulting, Mr. Amaresh Mehrish, Director, Huawei Telecommunications, Ms. Abhilasha Gaur, Vice President- Skill Development, Algol Group, Mr. Abhay Kapoor, HR Head, North India Operations, Amazon India and Mr. Vikas Gupta, Chairman, VFN Group. Panel discussion started with a question on how do the industry, government and academia come together to address the skill gap. A need to bridge the gap between academia and industry was emphasized. It was stated that there is a big role of academia on experiential learning. An individual should be agile in learning and vocational experience is a must to enter into an industry. Whether entering into the corporate set up or having a startup, exposure to different fields is a must. This approach helps in understanding the problems and challenges that lie ahead. Skills like abilities to have risk appetite & right attitude, communicate well with people, patience, power to analyze everything (learn handling and being comfortable with data), learning quickly and continuously developing competencies, skill to learn-unlearn-relearn, setting expectations and hard work is necessary along with a strong emphasis on soft skills, importance of relationship building and stress management, develop leadership mindset, acquire depth of knowledge on a particular subject, millennial need to work on their lack of patience, attention span and have realistic expectations. Academia needs to focus on imparting experiential learning, through live projects and developing soft skills of millennial students.

Second Panel Discussion theme was "Retention and Engagement Strategies for Millennial". Esteemed panelist were Session Moderator-Ms. Usha Srivastava, HR Head, Vodafone Idea Ltd., Ms. Ritu Anand, HR Head, Terumo Global, Mr. Sanjiv Jain, Co-Founder & Director, Enabling World, Ms. Gaurav Saini, HR Director, HMD Global (Home for Nokia Phones), India & MENA, Mr. Hegeler Solomon, Director, People

& Organization, Mars Wrigley Confectionery, Mr. Madhukar Pandey, Resourcing Lead, Barclays India Operations and Mr. Sheril Beotra, Director HR, Crowne Plaza Hotels (IHG). There were several strong points emphasizing different strategies that need to be adopted to engage and retain them. First an understanding of millennial work characteristics was defined and it was discussed that millennial have opinions-consult them, they want communication-engage them. They need to participate-involve them. They want flexibility and therefore give more autonomy, accommodate them. Millennial are not impatient, they have a need for speed. We must utilize this trait. A study by Deloitte on "Simply Irresistible Jobs" give 5 things employers must do right: provide meaningful jobs, encourage hands on management, create a culture of inclusion, provide growth opportunities and foster trust in leadership. Make the eco-system inclusive i.e. "You can be You". Millennial want their employers to work for the community as well. Cross function partnership necessary. Hands-on management, level of coaching and mentoring, growth opportunities, trust in leadership, communication is vital, keeping them engaged in things they like, providing freedom, flexibility, listening and learning is all important to engage and retain millennial.

In the Valedictory session, Mr. Manoj Sahani, Executive Director, Corporate Resource Center, GDGU briefed on both the panel discussions and the value addition to the knowledge repository on millennial skills, their retention and engagement strategies. He shared his own experiences. He thanked the panelist for their time and also for sharing their expertise and views in helping bridging the gap between industry and academia. He also thanked the entire team for putting up this event. The Summit was represented by over 100 industry delegates, PhD Scholars, HR faculty and management students.







GD Goenka CIArb (India) International Commercial Arbitration Competition 2018

School of Law, GD Goenka University organized the GD Goenka ClArb (India) International Commercial Arbitration Competition 2018 from 30 November to 2 December 2018. Twenty four teams both national and international participated in the competition. The inaugural session of the GD Goenka CIArb (India) International Commercial Arbitration Competition 2018 took place at Hyatt Regency, New Delhi. The event was a grand success with an august gathering of renowned legal dignitaries who shared their thoughts on international commercial arbitration law, legal ethics and importance of arbitration law.

The inaugural address was delivered by the former Chief Justice of India, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Dipak Misra, who has given various landmark decisions in a very short span of time that will stand firm in history. With his immense experience, HMJ Dipak Misra discussed about legal ethics and how pragmatic dispute settlement mechanism is in present times. Hon'ble Mr. Justice Dipak Misra advised the students to have complete understanding of law and expand their horizon. Dr. Lalit Bhasin [President CIArb (India), President, SILF was the key-note speaker for the day. He emphasised on professional ethics in **Arbitration Law and how it is litigant friendly.** Dr. Bhasin called each participant a winner who had participated in the International Commercial Arbitration Competition from different universities, both national and international. Hon'ble Mr. Justice Lingala Narasimha Reddy, Chairman, Central Administrative Tribunal, Principal Bench, New Delhi, in his special address, discussed about arbitration as the future of law and also mentioned that it will not just be an alternative dispute resolution mechanism but the better dispute settlement mechanism. Mr. Nipun Goenka - Managing Director, GD Goenka Group, Prof. Dr. Suku Bhaskaran - President, GDGU, Prof. (Dr). S.Shanthakumar – Pro-Vice Chancellor, GDGU and all Deans of different Schools were also present for the occasion.

After rigorous sessions in the quarter finals of the competitive GD Goenka CIArb(India) International Commercial Arbitration Competition, 2018, four best teams out of eight were selected to proceed to the semifinals. The eminent debating and the level of the negotiations by the participating teams took the judges by surprise. However, at the end of such an impactful session, the esteemed judges chose the two most

deserving teams as the finalists.

Mr Lalit Bhasin, President, ClArb (India), SILF, was the Chief Guest of the Valedictory session. Mr. Ganesh Chandru, Executive Partner at Lakshmi kumaran & Sridharan and Mr. Ajay Thomas, Vice-Chair of the ICC India Arbitration Group (IAG) judged the Finale along with Mr. Lalit Bhasin. BLOOD DONATION CAMP





The students of First Year B Arch and B Plan programmes went on a site visit to explore the historical context of Hauz Khas with faculty members, Mr. Pritam Lenka and Mr. Lakshay Mittal on 15 September 2018. Through a heritage walk, the students explored the built form of monuments from various eras of Delhi Sultanate. Guest Lecture

Guest Lecture on Flows and Typologies by Anupam Bansal

A Guest Lecture was delivered by an eminent architect and urbanist. Mr. Anupam Bansal, Principle Architect at ABRD Architects, on 26 October 2018. The lecture was focused on "Flows and Typologies" wherein 'Flow' refers to large scale design projects and 'Typology' refers to stand alone building projects. Through the lecture, Anupam Bansal tried to explain and sensitize the students towards the importance of designing the buildings while preserving their natural habitat. He also laid emphasis on design as a process by exhibiting few of his projects. He inspired the students to use 'sketching as a medium of learning for architects'. The lecture grabbed the interest of a large number of students.



Guest Lecture by Architect Aarti Dhingra on Sustainable Building Practices

The School organized a guest lecture by Architect Aarti Dhingra on "Use of Alternative Materials and Sustainable Building Practices" for construction to help save the Environment on 17 October 2018.

A graduate from the School of Planning and Architecture, New Delhi, Aarti works on projects with local craftsmen in Kumaon region, and associates herself with NGOs like 'Alaap' and 'Aarohi' for designing rural home-stays, and to learn and implement techniques of native forest and heritage conservation for the region. She shared her journey of personal transformation as an architect where her use of sustainable building practices made her and her buildings more connected and relevant to nature and the community of that region. Following her passion for building with natural materials, she recently received a scholarship to participate at Base Habitat, which focuses on advanced modern earth architecture for development, combining vernacular wisdom, modern technology and material sciences. Through her lecture, the students were inspired to work hands-on with natural materials and think of sustainability as a core discipline of architecture.

Workshops

5 Day Module on Place Making: Mehrauli, New Delhi

School of Architecture and Planning organized a 5 Day Module for first, second and third year students on "Heritage Appreciation and Development of Design Skills" rooted in traditional knowledge systems from 26 to 28 September and 3 to 4 October 2018 by esteemed Conservation Architect Smita Datta Makhija, Principal Architect AVESANA. Her expertise is in Contextual Design and Conservation of Historic Buildings.



Innovative Teaching Methods



7th Semester Elective- Everyday Design Exploration

"Everyday Design Exploration" is one of the electives introduced in the curriculum of the 4th year batch of the Bachelors of Architecture programme. The subject is taught by renowned Architect and Director of the School, Mr. Nirmal Kulkarni with focus on involving students into just not architecture but also exploration beyond it. The aim is to believe that architecture can be done best if we understand daily routines of a human being in every aspect. In the very first project, which was a timed problem of 3 hours and to be done in studio itself, students were supposed to decide one everyday usage product as primary element and get 100 units of the product. The task was to design another everyday usage product from those 100 pieces and using only two secondary elements to bind and design it.



Parametric Installations

Students of the School have been introduced to a new course "Computational Design" taught by coveted architect Mr. Abhishek Bij where the students of third and fourth years were divided into groups and every group was asked to make a component based on the 'line of force' principle and explore the possibilities in which the said component can possibly grow. Upon exploring the possibility of the growth patterns, and the clarity of rules, five different installations were created and assembled in the department emerging from floor, walls or ceilings. The installations could grow in any direction as long as it adheres to the defined rules.

Ayanagar: Vertical Design Studio

A vertical studio was organised for second, third and fourth year students as part of Architectural Design taking a 'provisionally regularized' unauthorized colony of Aya Nagar, situated on the southwestern edge of Delhi

The focus of the studio was on generating possibilities in urban housing for all. Students explored generative bottom-up design process which focused on the dwelling unit as the basic design unit. To encourage personalization, students were encouraged to generate formal solutions which were robust and absorbed individual personalization without losing core design ideas.

Place Making, Mehrauli Module, 26 September 2018

day 1

On day one of the Module, the students were introduced to settlement history of Delhi, its topography, site selection criteria for each of the 13 settlements located in the area bounded by the Aravallis and the River Yamuna through a highly interaction based puzzle game wherein they understood the context of the settlement in relation to each period of significant change in the built fabric history of Delhi. The students also made ideograms of the settlement pattern of Mehrauli based on a mental map.

Place Making, Mehrauli Module, 27 September 2018



On Day two of the Module, the students went to Qutub Minar Complex where Ms. Smita Dutta Makhija introduced the students to Mehrauli and its subsequent development through various periods of history. The students understood the progression through sketching at different parts of the complex. Apart from architectural conversations, various topics related to religion, philosophy and beliefs were also discussed. Architect Smita also took the students to Jahaz Mahal, Hauz-i-Shamsi and the Mughal period Jharna where they described their views on importance of heritage and their experience of the day.

Day 3: Place Making, Mehrauli Module, 28 September 2018

On Day three of the Module, the students dealt with evolution of typologies of the built fabric and spaces along with layering of each period development on an older layer to generate the urban fabric we see today. The Qutub complex, mainly, the Qila Lal Kot, Qila Rai Pithora and the Sultanate Qutub complex were studied by the students to identify distinct developments of architectural styles, artistic traditions and transformation in the ways of living.

Materiality and Buildability Workshop on System and Structures

The School organized a 2 day Materiality and Buildability Workshop for 1st, 2nd and 4th year students on 30 and 31 October 2018 by eminent Architect Practitioner and Academician, Prof. Suresh Vaidya Rajan in C Block, Model

Making Lab in campus. The theme of the workshop was "Systems and Structure of Bricks, Arches and Geodesic Domes".

On day 1 of the Workshop, the students were initially introduced to various arches, vaults and domes along with their examples through a brief presentation. The presentation was followed by the explanation of overall structural mechanism and forces working on arches and vaults by creating miniature brick models. Later, the students were asked to create models of various vaults and domes by making clay bricks and joining them using Plaster of Paris.


On day 2 of the workshop, the theme was "Decoding Geodesic Domes" wherein the aim was to work on geodesic domes models by different ways of construction and different materials. Students were asked to arrange for some basic materials like garden hose pipe, straws, skewers, and some binding materials like stapler, glue etc. The workshop was started with a small basic model made of paper to let students understand the basic construction of domes taking it further to larger models which were supposed to be done in groups of four. The students showcased tremendous team spirit and came out with commendable models which proved that the idea behind the workshop was clear to them.




Hands-on Session in a Construction Yard





Educational tour to ICAR Institutes – An orientation of students to modern molecular techniques

The School organized a two-day educational tour to ICAR-Indian Institute of Maize Research (IIMR), Pusa Campus, New Delhi from 26 to 27 November 2018. The objective was to provide students an insight about biotechnology tools and techniques being used in molecular breeding of crops.

To make students aware and get better understanding of the molecular processes, the first session was taken by Dr. Chikkappa G. Karjagi, Scientist (Maize Breeding). He presented an overview of maize research over the years and highlighted the importance of climate resilience in maize based cropping system through novel breeding techniques. He discussed multidisciplinary and multilocation research trials of maize to identify appropriate technologies for varied agro-climatic conditions of India. In another session, Dr. Krishan Kumar, Scientist (Agricultural Biotechnology)introduced the students to molecular techniques of maize breeding and explained working of Thermo cycler, Autoclave, Agro Gel Electrophoresis and UV Spectrophotometer. The students were also acquainted with tissue culture techniques and gene transfer methods being used in maize.

To equip the students with concept of crop production under controlled environmental conditions, the students were taken to glass house. The experimental trials of herbicide resistance in tobacco plants and screening of maize for growth in nutrient deficient soils were explained in this session. The concept of hydroponics were also explained to the students.





Field Visits



Visit to KVK, Bhopani, Faridabad

In the orientation programme of students to KVKs, the second visit was planned to KVK, Bhopani, Faridabad on 29 and 30October. The KVK hosted around 170students over these two days. The students were provided with both the theoretical as well as practical knowledge about agricultural practices through lectures by subject specialists and field visit. Dr. R. B. Gupta, Head, KVK explained aboutOn Farm Trials (OFTs) to identify the location specificity of agricultural technologies under various farming systems. Front-line demonstrations to establish production potentials of technologies on the farmers' fields were explained by extension specialist, Dr. Vijaypal Singh, PES (Extension Education). He introduced the students to basic physico-chemical properties of soil. The specialist from post-harvest management, Smt. Sunita Chawla, SES (Home Sciences) briefed the students about preservation and processing techniques of fruits and vegetables.

The students took tour of research farm of KVK on both the days and got to know about different farming systems including agro-forestry, vermi-compost unit; its structure and process of preparing the manure.

Visit to KVKs – Introduction of students to resource and knowledge centre of agricultural technologies

This School was initiated in this academic session. With an objective to orient the students of B. Sc. Agriculture programme to the frontier areas of technology and its dissemination, the visits of students to KVKs (KrishiVigyanKendras) were arranged so that they get knowledge about multidisciplinary areas like Crop Production, Plant Protection, Horticulture, Home Science, Agro-Forestry, Extension Education, Animal Husbandry and get equipped with modern research techniques. Three visits have been organised by School of Agricultural Sciences since July 2018.

Visit to KVK, Mandkola

The School organized a two-day visit to KVK, Mandkola, Mewat, Haryana during 11–12 October 2018. The objective of this visit was to provide students an insight regarding internal working of KVK and give them the opportunity to learn practically through interaction regarding the various farming practices including types of species identification, agriculture implements, use of devices for application of pesticides/weedicides/insecticides etc.

The visit started with the welcome note given by Dr. B. K. Sharma who is acting as the Senior Coordinator in KVK Mandkola. He explained to the students, various applications and utility of KVK Mandkola for the farmers. After it, Dr. Ranbir Singh Saini, Senior Extension Specialist, explained the use of various agricultural implements and commercial fruit production in Haryana. Finally, in the last session, presentation was floated for the students in the lecture hall describing the entire functions of KVK, Mandkola.













Four-day long Faculty Development Programme on "Emerging Trends in Teaching, Research and Publishing" from 24 July 2018 to 27 July 2018 was organized.

The team also had Ms. Iti Khurana, who spoke extensively about understanding the dynamics of book publishing industry and market

The FDP ended with an enriching session with Prof. (Dr.) S. Shantha Kumar, Pro Vice Chancellor, GDGU, who threw light on "Educating Millennials: Challenges and Strategies".



Workshops

During the inaugural talk, Mr. Manoj, Technical Advisor, Robotech Labs emphasised on importance of IoT. The first day of the workshop covered Introduction to the Internet of Things along with the Basics of Sensors & Actuators, Raspberry Pi Platform and its architectural layout, settings of the Pi and Python Scripting & Interface of Sensors. Mr. Manoj highlighted on how to use GPIO Pins, Interfacing sensors with Raspberry Pi and discussed the way of reading data value from sensors, which was highly interactive and knowledgeable.

Second day of the workshop was focussed on the 'Home automation and security system' which started from basic concept of relays , capturing pictures using webcam which was really enlightening and interactive, enabling your IoT Device to use WhatsApp, creating WhatsApp App on your Device, creating lists, Automated Message Triggering and finally Thing speak/AWS Cloud Computing concepts connecting Pi to the cloud, store/retrieve data on Cloud. The resource persons were open to discussion with participants and emphasized on the need to explore more in the emerging field of cyber security. The workshop was attended by undergraduate/graduate/post-graduate students, research scholars, and academicians and corporate professionals. The participants of this workshop were from Ericsson Company, KR Mangalam University, Punjab University, Apeejay Satya University and NSIT. The total number of participants was 67.





Arduino Workshop: A Hands-on Approach for Science Students

A rudimentary workshop on the usability of Arduino, entitled 'Arduino: A Hands-on Approach', was held on 26 October 2018 at Department of Basic and Applied Sciences. The workshop was attended by students from Physics and Mathematics specializations. During the workshop, students were introduced to the concept and usability of the Arduino platform along with a practical session on Arduino platform explaining basic Input / Output techniques and control. The workshop effectively conveyed the importance and usability of such platforms for the domains of physical and mathematical inquisition. Participants enjoyed learning, they did lots of hands-on practice.

The resource person for this workshop was Pranshu Ranakoti, B. Tech. (CSE) 4th year student from School of Engineering at GD Goenka University. Pranshu is a budding cyber security expert who has written research papers and attended several training sessions on cyber security including a summer internship at Gurugram Cyber Cell. Some of the key takeaways mentioned by the audience (students) were: Deep understanding of the network scanning phase, Gained knowledge about Linux environment, Learning Commands for Network Related things and Understood How an android phone on different Network can be hacked with an app.

Guest Lectures



Guest lecture on RAC, by Director of Haiger India Air Conditioning Pvt. Ltd.

Department of Mechanical and Chemical Engineering organized a guest lecture by Mr. Rishi Pathak, Director of Haiger India Air Conditioning Pvt. Ltd., on 4 October 2018. In his address, the students learnt about the working principle of the Refrigeration and Air Conditioning (RAC) system. He also explained the difference between the RAC and HVAC (Heating Ventilation and Air Conditioning). Guest Lecture on "Expectations of Industrialists from Freshers"

A guest lecture on Expectations of Industrialists from Freshers by Mr. Subhash Tyagi, Chairman, Gold Plus Glass Industry Limited was organized on 24 August 2018. Mr. Tyagi entered the Glass Industry in 1985 by setting up a trading company. In a span of 25 years, he set up India's largest glass processing units and first fully Indian owned float glass plant in India. Gold Plus has grown with the changing scenario of glass industry in India. It believes that the growth in this sector is imminent. The lecture was organized for the students of B. Tech/BCA/ B.Sc. (IT) and MBA. The session began with sharing of experiences by Mr. Tyagi, which led and kept him on the path from a trader to a successful businessperson. He encouraged the students by quoting that every person has the potential to become an entrepreneur. He enlightened the students with the attributes that industries seek in a candidate. During his talk, he also emphasized on the importance of being ethical, focused and determined to achieve any goal in life. The speaker addressed various questions asked by the students. He shared the idea of faculty writing lessons from their experiences and discussing it in class, which are not found in standard University text books. The lecture was followed by Mr. Tyagi's visit to the laboratories and other facilities of the University. He was pleasantly surprised at the growth of the University in such a short time and appreciated the vision of the organization.

Such guest lectures by renowned personalities in their respective domains is a regular feature at GD Goenka University where students and faculty members get to learn from the real life experiences of the eminent industry leaders and academicians.



Field Visits

Visit to CSIR-NPL Lab

M.Sc. Chemistry, M.Sc. Physics and B.Sc. (H) Physics students of School of Engineering, visited CSIR-National Physical Laboratory on 28 September 2018. The objective of the visit was to help students understand the importance of metrology.

During the visit, students learned about the science underlying the working of a solar panel, advanced characterization techniques, different experimental procedures and instruments, utilization of waste plastic bags and bottles in the form of tiles which can be used for designing the structure for making a smart toilet or any other structure for societal usage. They visited the Fluid Flow metrology unit, and AC High Voltage and Current metrology that maintains the National Standards of AC High Voltage Ratio upto 100kV, AC High Current Ratio upto 5 kA and High Voltage Capacitance & Tan δ up to 200 kV.

Students also interacted with the Scientists and Research associates working in various Labs.

They encouraged students to study well and opt research as their career.

Overall, it was a very good learning experience for students.



Industrial Visit to ABB India Ltd., Faridabad

Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering organized an industrial visit to ABB India Ltd., Faridabad for its 2nd, 3rd and final year students on 26 October 2018. ABB (ASEA Brown Boveri) is a Swedish-Swiss multinational corporation headquartered in Zurich, Switzerland, operating mainly in robotics, power, heavy electrical equipment and automation technology areas.

The objective of this visit was to provide students an insight regarding internal working of the company and an opportunity to learn practically through interaction regarding the manufacturing, packaging in the plant. To make students aware and have better understanding of the processes, the technical instructors started with the description of the comprehensive range of reliable and high efficiency motors offered by ABB. It also included a detailed description about Smart Sensor for motors.

During this visit, it was explained to the students how the traditional motors, pumps and mounted bearings are converted into smart, wirelessly connected devices; how the key parameters from the surface of the equipment are measured, and which are then used to gain meaningful information on the condition and performance of the equipment, enabling users to identify inefficiencies within their system and to reduce risks related to operation and maintenance. Then, according to actual needs, maintenance can be planned, rather than depending on generic schedules. Thus, extending the lifetime of equipment, cutting down of maintenance costs and reduction or prevention of unplanned downtime due to breakdowns. Students were also given a peep into the activities of the control room.





Industrial Visit to Sun Pharmaceutical Pvt. Ltd.



School Internship Program I

The Undergraduate students of the School (BA/B Sc B Ed Sem V) underwent School Internship Progam-I from 22 October 2018 onwards. This was the very first experience for the budding teachers to get acquainted with the working of the schools. The student-teachers got knowledge about the infrastructure of the school. They learnt about the guidelines which are followed while constructing the school plant, especially how the primary, secondary and higher sections are segregated. They observed various aspects of school like the administrative department, sports facilities, special education facilities if any, functioning of the library and all other such aspects. They observed the play-ground, library, canteen, laboratories, classrooms and assembly halls.


School Experience Program I

The School organized the School Experience Program I for the students of B Ed 1st Semester from 29 October 2018 onwards. As part of the Teacher Education Program students are expected to undergo an internship in schools during which they simply observe the working of the school. This is their very first experience of school where they get to witness the school with a different perspective i.e. one that of a teacher.

In the present session (2018-19), students were sent to Govt. Middle School, Dhunella, Gurugram. This wide gap in the experience which the student-teachers got really widened their horizons with respect to school patterns and the teaching-learning experiences.

They felt enriched after the program and said that they learnt a lot from this real experience. This training set the ball rolling for their future internship training and learning.





Field Visits to places of Historical and Cultural Significance



The inaugural game design "Hackathon" was hosted by GD Goenka University in collaboration with SoFD, Unity and Finland based Kajaani University from 28 - 30 September 2018, actively led by Dean SOFD, Prof. Sasi Menon. Kajaani University is one of Finland's leading universities with one of the best gaming design courses in the EU.

campus throughout the event providing mentorship and technical assistance; and with the assistance of faculty members of the School, Mr. Mohit Bhardwaj, Mr. Shantanu Chatterjee and Mr. Arjun Sharan, the students managed to come up with a playable game as the clock struck 1pm on Sunday afternoon. 






Industry Visit: Parryware

CIArb- India branch has launched student membership drive to promote ADR to the coming generation of legal practitioners.

Guest Lectures

Guest Lecture by Dr. Alvin Leeon 'Enterprise and Innovation'

Dr. Alvin Lee, Faculty in Marketing for the Deakin Business School and the Director of the Master of Marketing visited the campus and addressed students. Dr. Alvin started the lecture by highlighting how the world is changing. He stated that today we talk about digital currency instead of hard currency and along with IPOs (Initial Public Offering) we discuss Initial Coin Offerings (ICOs) this fast changing world is actually a result of innovations happening in every area. To remain competitive in this dynamic environment, companies are realising that talented staff members need to be hired who can help in making money for the company through their innovative ideas. Dr. Alvin asked what makes someone an Innovator. Is it the idea, process or the technology? He explained it is actually a way of life which combines what the person loves to do, what the world needs, what the world will pay and what the person is great at. Success is a combination of all these. What one achieves at the end is personal and monetary achievement. He also highlighted that an entrepreneur is someone who seeks to change the world. He starts with an idea of innovation and pushes the boundaries for profit. He acts as a thought leader who tries to make money and create a difference in the industry (through disruption). He cited the examples of Uber, Airbnb, companies which have changed the meaning of success in today's world. Dr. Alvin ended the session by listing out 8 key qualities of a 'founder' - acumen, adjustment, ambition, originator, people-focus, grit, persuasion and team build. He encouraged students to think big and motivated them towards being successful entrepreneurs.





Guest Lecture by Mr. Jayant Kwatra on 'Financial Services and Career'

The School organized a guest lecture on 'Financial services and career' by Mr. Jayant Kwatra, a business partner with Motilal Oswal Finacial Services Limited. Mr. Kwatra started the lecture by explaining to the students the need for making investments. He discussed how youth of the country is focussed more on spending than saving. With change in lifestyle, the traditional instruments are not preferred any more as these are unable to generate a return higher than inflation for the current investors. On comparing various instruments of investments, he highlighted that investment in equity gives much higher return than other instruments like mutual funds or more traditional instruments like Bank savings. Fixed deposits, Bonds, etc. Mr. Kwatra discussed that investment in the Indian corporate sector yields a good return over a long term period of time and supports the principle of Be Indian and Buy Indian. The confidence in the success of Indian corporates is reflected by the large investments made by Foreign Institutional Investors in the Indian stock market. He also advised students about various career options in the field of financial services and encouraged them to enrol for specialized courses in the area of finance for a bright future.



Guest Lecture on 'Nonviolent Conflict Resolution'

As a part of Community Service module, the School organised a lecture session on 'Nonviolent Conflict Resolution' based on the teachings of Mahatma Gandhi on 14 November 2018.
